Y-12 Incident Command Issues 2008

November 2008, during an Independent Oversight Inspection of EM at Y-12:

- WSI provides limited training on incident command responsibilities to their incident command staff.
- The WSI sergeants who respond to the emergency scene have not taken any incident command training.

Y-12 Incident Command Issues 2009

Y-12 EME9-4 (Limited Scope Exercise)

“The on-scene commander re-routed the ORPD through New Hope Road and Portal #5 to arrive at the CP. This re-route "cost" 8-10 minutes in response time by the ORPD assets.”

Y-12 Incident Command Issues 2010

Y-12 EME10-3

- “The establishment of unified or transfer of incident command was not accomplished.”
- “Command and control of the incident/event scene was inadequate.”
- “Most command post duties and responsibilities were not completed (maintain incident scene access control, accountability of personnel entering the event scene, establishing a staging location, etc.) as is required by....”
- “The arriving officers were not sure who was in command and no direct link up, either by radio or telephone, was ever made between the ranking ORPD officer and Beta 2.”


