- SharePoint folders are ready for population. Post "indexes" for any sensitive or OUO information that should not be populated into the folders with instructions to contact owner of document directly. Folders already created include:

 - Radiological
 - Technical Rescue
 - Vehicle Purchase (current specs on engines for others to utilize)

- Chief Fauerbach is working on the possibility of a live feed demonstration involving a UAV during the NTS tour.
