FFRWG Annual Meeting – Monday Session

- Chuck will take the following details and provide timings for each session so the group agenda can be created for inclusion in the overall EMI SIG agenda.
- **Submitted Presentations** first thing Monday morning - heard in the following order:
 - **Lisa Gilbreth, B&W Pantex** (Pantex's Emergency Radiation Treatment Facility – a unique partnering approach to ensuring treatment of contaminated injured personnel)
 - Pantex partners with the U.S. Veterans Administration to provide treatment for contaminated injured personnel. This presentation will provide the history and reasoning for the current setup as well as some pros and cons of this arrangement.
 - Treating contaminated injured personnel requires both site and external resources. Only quality emergency management leadership ensures a successful outcome for the stakeholders involved.
 - Lisa Gilbreth has worked at Pantex since 1986. She has been a radiation safety professional for most of that time. She joined Pantex Emergency Management this year and is responsible for some immediate improvements in site ERO training. Additionally, she pulls together both her knowledge of training and her knowledge of radiation safety when she leads the team that responds at the Pantex Emergency Radiation Safety Treatment Facility.
 - **Eugene McPeek & Dennis Cavalier, Sandia National Lab** (Active Shooter SOP Development)
 - The purpose of this briefing is to describe the Active Shooter SOP and mutual aid response procedures by Sandia EM, Sandia Security, KAFB LE, the FBI, and OSI to an Active Shooter.
 - Emergency Field response.
 - Eugene McPeek: Retired with over 20 years as the Deputy Fire Chief of Albuquerque Fire Department, and over 6 years as the Operations Manager for Emergency Management at Sandia National Laboratories. Retired U.S. Marine Command Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps with

over 20 years military service to include combat experience during the Gulf War.

- Dennis Cavalier: 12 years experience in Emergency Management as an Incident Commander, and over 14 years as a Special Weapons and Tactics Response Team leader all at Sandia National Laboratories. Retired U.S. Army Reserves Major with over 24 years military service to include combat experience in Iraq.
- **Roger Paul, Y-12 (Incident Command During Security Events)**
 - Presentation will discuss the Y-12 Emergency Management creative strategy for ensuring an effective Incident Command/NIMS structure is established during security related events. Discussion will include the integration of Fire, EMS, Security, and offsite response resources into singular response entity capable of mitigating a security related emergency.
 - Joint leadership between Y-12's Emergency Management, Fire Protection Operations, Protective Force, and Shift Superintendent's Office to plan, prepare, and implement an effective command structure that was both functional and compliant.
 - Roger Paul - Sixteen years experience as a Paramedic/Firefighter with 10 of those years at Y-12 working for Fire Protection Operations as a Firefighter then serving as the department training officer for five years. The past two and half years have been spent working in Y-12 Emergency Management managing the Building/Facility Emergency Plan program and dividing time assisting in the drill and exercise program.
- **Site Status Briefings** following the formal presentations. Site briefings will include current status of emergency program, current events, and challenges. Each briefing will be no more than 10 minutes in length.
- **Panel Discussion / Round Table** will address challenges facing the various response organizations across the DOE Complex. Additionally, we will discuss national trends in response methods, unified incident command processes, individual site response capability improvements, technology upgrades, staffing issues and other topics. Below are the panel discussion topics in order:
 - **Brenda Anderson** will then have an opportunity to cover Lessons Learned on the LANL fires. Additional discussion will include Lessons Learned template and the Training Sub Committee update.
 - **Mike Brock & Scott Hackler** will cover the Y-12 and Pantex shared training credits topic.
 - **Emergency Services Baseline Needs Assessment (BNA)** topic includes site formats and a look at standardizing options.
 - **New / Revised 1066 Standard**
 - **Equivalencies / Exemption Processes** will also cover a sub-topic of Contractor / Federal AHJ Responsibilities and Interface.

- **Managing Fitness / Wellness (Rob Still)** in an Aging Department
- **Seismic Events (Rob Still)** "beyond design basis" scenario this year for our annual practice exercise
- **Election for Group Leadership** will take place with a ballot box and nomination cards. The position up for election is Vice Chair (who will be promoted to Chair the following year).
- **Incident Command Working Session** for standardization and training products across the DOE Complex.
 - **Type I, II, III DOE Specific Incident Management Team (IMT) Concept Development** will include sub-topic of incident scenario types.
 - **Emergency Responder Credentialing and Training Standards (DOE Specific)** will include sub-topics for Fire, EMS, Hazmat, and Technical Rescue.

- **FFRWG Group Flyer** will be reviewed and updated after the annual meeting display photos are determined and group content can be revised.
- **Video Teleconferencing Options** are cost prohibitive and could top \$5-8K if included for our Monday Session at the annual meeting. Therefore we will be implementing a traditional voice line.
