



## Industrial Hygiene/ Occupational Safety Special Interest Group

The Industrial Hygiene/Occupational Safety Special Interest Group (IH/OS SIG) is a network of personnel from the Department of Energy (DOE) community involved in occupational safety and health (S&H) issues. The SIG provides the DOE community with tools for the development, enhancement, and/or implementation of programs and training designed to improve worker S&H.

The SIG serves as an informal network to exchange information to meet S&H professionals' needs at their worksite. Information can be exchanged through a Listserv email tool, the SIG Website (<https://orise.orau.gov/ihos/index.htm>), and meetings such as the SIG Steering Committee conference calls and the annual DOE and DOE Industrial Hygiene Contractors meeting.

Includes four training modules that demonstrate the safety walkaround process, a process for managers to walk a workspace and engage workers in collaborative discussions about safety in the workplace.
