Federal Energy Management Program

The Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) administers a special DOE Scholars Program for Veterans. This program introduces students or recent college graduates to the Department of Energy and other federal agencies' missions and operations. As a DOE Scholar, you will have a competitive edge by familiarizing yourself with federal agency functions while showcasing your education, talent, and skills.



Veterans are given preference with the Federal Energy Management Program which places interns at federal agencies in the Washington, D.C. area.

Disciplines: Engineering; physical sciences; environmental sciences; computer science and information technology; physics; business; policy; program management; mathematics; statistics; safety and health; accounting and finance; law; communications; and other energy related fields.

Eligibility: U.S. Citizens Only. Undergraduate, graduate or post-graduate of an accredited institute of higher education.

Veterans Preference Locations: Veterans are selected by the Federal Energy Management Program which places interns at federal agencies in the Washington, D.C. area.

Duration: June 5 - August 11, 2017

Deadline: Applications accepted October 1, 2016 through December 15, 2016.

Benefits: Stipends are \$750 per week, housing allowance of \$300 per week, and daily commute expenses of \$20 per week. Inbound and outbound travel to and from the appointment site will be reimbursed up to \$1,000 for participants living more than 50 miles one way from their appointment site.
