Dr. Twyla Baker is an enrolled citizen of the Three Affiliated Tribes of Fort Berthold, and lives in New Town, North Dakota. She currently serves as the President of Nueta Hidatsa Sahnish College. She comes from a family with deep Indigenous values who are committed to stewardship of her Tribal homelands, and the growth of people in personal and professional realms. Dr. Baker holds a B.S. in Environmental Geology and Technology, an M.S. in Education, and a Ph.D. in Teaching and Learning/Research Methodology from the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks, ND. She is a Bush Foundation Native

Nation Rebuilder, and currently serves on the Executive Committee of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium (AIHEC), the American Indian College Fund (AICF), and the National Indian Education Association (NIEA). Formerly, she was director of the National Resource Center on Native American Aging in Grand Forks, ND, and co-founder of the National Indigenous Elder Justice Initiative. She has published numerous scholarly works and articles in popular publications and has contributed commentary on shows like *The ReidOut* with Joy Reid on MSNBC, the *Karen Hunter Show* on Sirius XM, *The Morning Show* on the Seven Network in Australia, and has been an on-air contributor on CNN and BBC One. She gives her time and skills in the areas of education, leadership, community development and philanthropy with several national boards and organizations. She is a former board chair of the American Indian Science and Engineering Society and the Native Governance Center, and her own Tribal Nation's chapter of the Boys and Girls Club.
